

MISSION STATEMENT



WHO WE SERVE

- Primarily juniors and seniors from the Kern High School District
- 25 different feeder high schools
- Three-hour block sessions during either the morning, afternoon, or evening
- Transportation and food services provided to all KHSD students
- Over 2,400 students enrolled this year
- Mirror the demographics of the KHSD

- Industry certifications








INDUSTRY PARTNERSHIPS

POSTSECONDARY PARTNERSHIPS

- Curriculum aligned with postsecondary partners
- Current partners are Bakersfield College, CSU Bakersfield, Taft College, and WestTec
- Majority of programs offer both high school and college credit
- Allows student to start the pathway in high school
- Supports students with a seamless transition to college



ENROLLEMNT PROCESS

- Online application available
 November 1st through early March for daytime programs
- Counselors from each homeschool select students to attend based on attendance, behavior, and academic standing
- Career Technicians visit high school campuses to promote programs
- Students notified in April of acceptance or placed on a waiting list
- Evening program applications open in May







FOLLOW-UP STUDY


- 2023 Graduate Results
- 67% of students contacted 6 months after graduation
- 57% are employed
- 4% enlisted in military
- 65% are enrolled in postsecondary education (22% higher than district rate)
 - 2/3 in community college
 - 1/3 in 4-year college/university







KHSD Career Training Center Enrollment Trends




*2022-2023 school year had a waiting list of over 1,200 students

EXPANSION PLAN

- Surveyed over 22,000 of our students to determine interests
- Reviewed labor market data postsecondary programs
- Created CTE focus group of KHSD leaders
- Visited model CTE schools around country
- Explored multiple delivery models
- Created a plan for which program areas to expand in based on information gathered
- Adjusted teacher pay scale to give credit for industry experience
- Developed summer onboarding program catered to transitioning people from industry to becoming teachers





COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

- Onboarded an architectural firm
- Formed design teams around specific training labs that included industry partners, CTE instructors and postsecondary partners
- Created renderings of various spaces to include in community presentations
- Created commercials highlighting ROC and ran in movie theaters
- Did many presentations to various community groups
- Passed a bond in fall of 2016 with over 70% approval rate. CTE expansion was the anchor for the bond.
- Leveraged CTEIG, K12 Strong Workforce, and CTE Facilities Grant to help with construction and equipment costs



DESIGNING PROGRAMS THAT ARE PART OF A PATHWAY


- Review labor market data

- Develop curriculum that leads to entry level employment and starts a pathway to postsecondary program









ROC EXPANSION PROJECT COMPLETED IN 2019





CTEC PROJECT COMPLETED IN 2020






NEXT STEPS

- Add additional classroom and lab space at ROC and CTEC campuses to meet student demand
- Expand in impacted areas where there is a workforce need
- Investigate new program areas aligned to future workforce needs
- Passed another bond in fall of 2023 to fund the project



ENTREPRENEURSHIP RESOURCE CENTERS

- Classes that educate 7th-12th graders in developing their entrepreneurial mindset, skills and ambitions
- One night a week for 10-12 weeks each semester plus week-long summer classes in June
- Ideation lab at both campuses where students can create prototypes of their products
